School Board Facts

Nearly 6,000 men and women serve on local public school boards in Illinois, governing the education of 2,001,548 students in 3,888 public schools across 852 school districts, and overseeing combined budgets of more than \$31 billion. School board members are elected by their local communities during a consolidated election held the first Tuesday of April in odd numbered years. They serve four year terms.
