Opening Keynote —

The Power of Story by Voice of Witness

How do you harness the power of the story? At Voice of Witness (VOW), an oral history nonprofit amplifying the voices of people impacted by injustice, storytelling is a powerful tool for connection, resistance, advocacy, and learning. This talk will cover VOW's principles for ethical storytelling and how they ensure our ability to listen deeply and share impactful narratives in a responsible, respectful way. Particularly in times of enormous upheaval and ideological division, creating "safe and brave" spaces for communities to share their stories provides opportunity for healing, enlightening, and vital experiences.

Workshop A: Practices for Ethical Storytelling in Your Districts and Communities by Voice of Witness

In this session, we will discuss the benefits of oral history as a pedagogical tool for teaching and learning both academic and socio-emotional skills. Building on the Voice of Witness methodology for ethics-driven storytelling, participants will engage in a variety of oral history activities that can be adapted to their classrooms, districts, and communities. Participants will have the opportunity to explore multiple student projects, generating ideas around how oral history may work in their classrooms, staff rooms, and board rooms.

Workshop B: Data-Based Storytelling for Social Justice by ISBE and IASB

During the first part of this workshop, representatives from the Illinois State Board of Education will lead participants on an investigation of the data underlying the Equity Journey Continuum (EJC) measure that appears on all Illinois school district annual report cards. During the second part of this workshop, board members will analyze the stories behind their EJC data using the Storytelling for Social Justice framework to move beyond stock, stereotypical stories and uncover the concealed stories and resistance stories truly at play.


