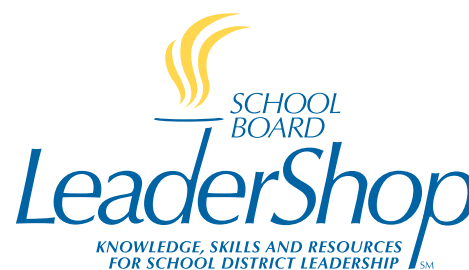

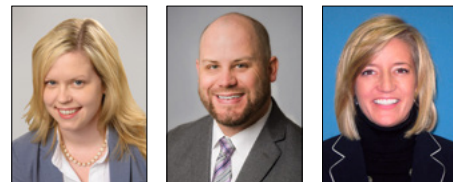

Professional Development Leadership Training (PDLT) and Performance Evaluation Reform Act (PERA) Training for School Board Members PDLTPERA

This course satisfies the requirements for mandatory board member training per 105 ILCS including instruction in education and labor law; financial oversight and accountability; and legal responsibilities. Every new school board member elected or appointed must complete within the first year of the first term. Performance Evaluation Reform Act (PERA) training is to prepare board members for their role in implementing the “optional alternative evaluation process,” as required per 105 ILCS 5/24-16.5.



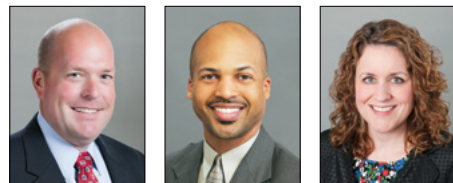

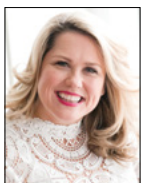

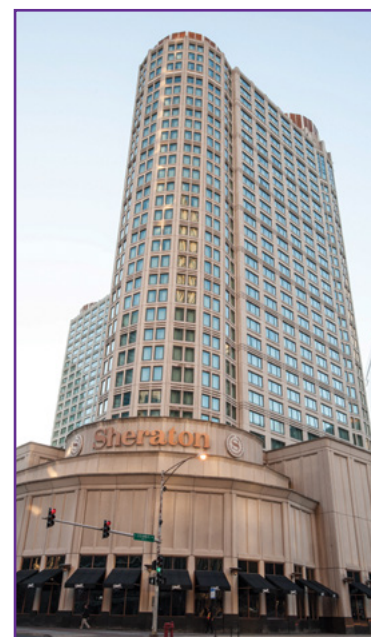
