## GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE DISTRICT AND THE AREA

LOCATION - The District is located adjacent to Interstate 55 in the center of Montgomery County, Illinois, 60 miles north of St. Louis and 38 miles south of Springfield IL. It is a largely rural area that is within driving distance of both St. Louis, MO and Springfield, IL.

Camp Panther [Pk-4] is a free 12-day summer camp with emphasis on reading/writing and enrichment activities.

Litchfield Middle School offers students a wide variety of elective courses including band, choir, culinary arts, guitar, drama, coding and STEM. All eighth graders take a career pathways course aligned to the Illinois PACE Framework.

Litchfield High School curriculum is aligned to the Illinois PACE Framework. Staff and administration worked with stakeholders to develop a Portrait of a Litchfield Graduate. All Juniors take an essential skills class. Students have the opportunity to select from 49 dual credit classes locally and receive credit from Land Community College. Students have the opportunity to take 3 dual credit courses locally and receive credit from St. Louis University. In addition, junior and senior high students have the opportunity to take College Now classes at the Lincoln Land Community College site.

**SPECIAL PROGRAMS** - Member of Mid State Special Education Cooperative, Montgomery County CTE Consortium, ROE #3 Alternative Education School and Cornerstone Menta Behavioral School.

FACILITIES - Litchfield Early Childhood Center (PK-1) renovation/new construction opens fall 2024; Litchfield Elementary School (2-5) new facility opened fall 2023. Litchfield Middle School (6-8); Litchfield High School (9-12); South Central Innovation Center (11-12) opened fall of 2023

**TRANSPORTATION** - The district owns and operates its own bus fleet with 9 bus routes. One transportation director, one mechanic and 10 drivers are employed in the department.
