In addition, RFHS offers multiple levels

of courses beyond regular ed in order to meet the needs of the varying levels of student learners, including honors and fundamental levels. RFHS is also affiliated with the Whiteside Area Career Center so that 11-12th grade students can seek career certification in fields such as nursing, cosmetology, auto mechanics, welding, construction, and computer technology.

**SPECIAL PROGRAMS** — RFHS offers varying programs to meet student needs, from community service, character ed, leadership, and academics. BLIND (Building Lasting Impressions that Never Die), is a character ed program based on the 40 Developmental Assets that teaches students tolerance, leadership, and resilience. RFHS also offers students an opportunity to be a part of the Jr. Optimist Club whose mission is "to develop leadership, promote community service, and foster friendship among its members". In addition, RFHS facilitates 9th-10th grade teams in order to monitor student achievement, discuss student concerns, strategize solutions, and celebrate successes. RFHS offers several academic programs, such as an early release incentive for those who meet the defined expectations, homeroom setting for those who do not earn the early release, and credit recovery for required credits needed for graduation.

**SPECIAL SERVICES** — The district is a member of the Bi-County Special Education Cooperative, offering services in Occupational, Physical, and Speech therapies and additional social services. The district's student support services include two full-time counselors and a full-time school social worker.
