The main source of income for the district is farmland. Manufacturing companies in neighboring communities provide employment opportunities for families. In 2004 a new elementary, junior high school was built. Bonds for that construction will be completely paid off in 2023.

High classes. They have PE, Band, and Library time available each day. High School students have a nine period day. Vocational classes in Agriculture and FCS are available. Junior and Seniors have the opportunity for dual credit classes and the opportunity to take classes through the IECC system. All students in grades K-1 have Chromebook tablets for classroom use. Grade 2- 12 students have Chromebooks assigned for their personal use. The district has fiber throughout the district and outside access points for community usage.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS — Preschool for All provides two half-day programs for children ages 3-5. Response to Intervention and Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports serve all students with varying levels of support based on need. Junior High basketball, cheerleading, and volleyball are available. Jr.High softball & baseball are offered through a coop in a neighboring district. High School sports are also offered through a coop with a neighboring district.

**SPECIAL SERVICES** — Clay City CUSD #10 provides special education services for children ages three through 21 through district staff and in partnership with South Eastern Special Education. ROE#12 provides an Alternative Education Program for students in grades 6-12.

**FACILITIES** — Clay City Elementary, Junior High, and High School are connected under one roof. The Elementary and Jr. High School was occupied in 2004 and the High School was built in 1936.

**TRANSPORTATION** — The school district operates four full time routes and one special education route. In 2023 the district purchased five full size buses. One bus, is equipped for handicap access.

**FOOD SERVICE** — SODEXO is the contracted food service used by the distinct for all students. Breakfast and lunch are served for all K - 12 grade students in the centralized commons.
